Dear Parents of Students in Grades 3-6,

For more than twenty years, Pennsylvania has tested the academic abilities of students using the Pennsylvania System of Student Assessment (PSSA). All students are included in this testing, with exclusions for only a very few students in special programs. This assessment provides schools with valuable information about student achievement and program quality.

The following chart outlines the testing window and Groveland's test dates. Please keep the chart as a reference for all of 2016 PSSA assessments and *make every effort for your child to be at school on those dates*. Testing will take place during the mornings.
