Using your text as a reference, **locate the page number of each of the places listed below**. The Finch residence should serve as your main point of Central Maycomb Residential; the Town Square will be the reference point for Central Maycomb Commercial; First Purchase Church will serve as the main point for Southern Maycomb. All other sites should be placed on the map in relationship to these points.

Include as many places as possible on your map. In some cases, exact locations are given, but in other places, only generalizations are made, so you'll have to give an approximate placement. This chart will be your key to drawing a realistic map of Maycomb. Be sure to include details of the events/descriptions at each locale.
