Dear Holicong Seventh Grader:

We are now less than a week away from your first day as an official Holicong Colonial! We are very excited to have you join our family, and know that along with the excitement of coming to middle school also comes many questions. We are here to answer all of them!

As we have noted from our previous emails, this is an exciting time to be a new student to Holicong. We are completing renovations in our library, commons area, classrooms, and other areas. We also have new electives courses, such as our Integrated Technology and Innovation and Creativity courses. You will be sitting with your new teams – we will have signs for you and our teachers will be there to guide you so you know exactly where to go.
