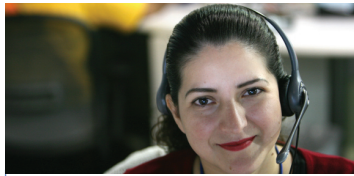




# Today in Pennsylvania
