There are a few things that you can do now to aid your child's transition into kindergarten and prepare for a successful year. First, there are many supplies that will be useful. Check out the included supply list to see what your child will need. Also, "warm up your child's brain!" That means READ, READ, READ with your child! It never hurts to learn something new from a great book or simply enjoy a good story that you read to your child. You may want to start a bedtime schedule/ routine sooner rather than later, too. We have very busy days. Following directions is tricky for our kindergarteners. Try giving directions to your child only one time and let them practice the follow through.
