# **★Course Description★**

The Grade 7 English/Language Arts Curriculum is comprised of four concept-based threads to explore throughout the year. These threads include Quest, Choices, Identity and Community. Students will learn and reinforce basic reading strategies and skills for reading more actively. In addition, students will focus on character and plot when reading fiction and refining reading strategies. The focus of writing in seventh grade is experimenting with descriptive, informative, and argumentative writing. Students will learn about argumentative writing and complete writing pieces that include an introduction, focused topic sentences, supporting details (such as direct quotations), a conclusion, and organizational features such as smooth transitions between and within body paragraphs. Core assessments are required and will be completed in the third or fourth marking period. By the end of the year, students will have studied four novels one drama, and a study of Greek mythology.

- \* Bring all materials, including your independent reading book to class each day.
- ★ Keep hands, feet, and objects to yourself.
- \* Follow directions the first time they are given.
- ★ Use appropriate language and appropriate classroom behavior.
