Our trip to Peace Valley is on October 4<sup>th</sup>. This trip is part of our science curriculum. We will be studying our local ecology and weather. It is a half-day trip, so we will eat lunch in the Bridge Valley cafeteria.

## What We Have Been Working On

In **social studies**, we have been working on note-taking methods and skills, while addressing the content in Chapter 3. Chapter 3 focuses on seven Native American cultural regions. There will be an "open notes" test, at the end of the chapter, next week. For this assessment, there is nothing that students need to study- they will use their notes to complete the test.

In **reading**, students have been using our standardized reading materials, MyView, to work through a unit entitled, *"Journeys."* 

In **language arts**, we are working with informative writing. Students are just finishing up a paragraph discussing their favorite food. Next, students will be researching and generating a 5-6 paragraph informative/research paper on a Native American tribe.

## Homework

I just wanted to provide a reminder about homework- especially reading. As I presented at Back to School Night, homework will consist primarily of mathematics and (independent) reading. I am hoping that you can assist me by making sure that your child has the time and space to engage in independent reading, for about 20-30 minutes, each evening.
