Holicong safety update A.L.I.C.E.

revising intruder on campus procedures

Our teachers are responsible for our children's welfare for the six or eight hours they are at school and we need to know without question that their safety will be paramount on the minds of teachers, faculty and volunteers.

Safety is our priority

Cameras & Secure Entryways Drills conducted (at least one drill per month):

- Fire
- Weather
- Evacuation (on-site)
- Evacuation (off-site)

- Shelter in Place
- o Lockdown

- Intruder on Campus ALICE





Why ALICE?



•Safety and Security is a priority for the Central Bucks School District

 Changes in Best Practices are occurring nationally for intruder on campus procedures

 ALICE is a set of proactive, options-based strategies that incorporates recommendations from the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), US Department of Education, and multiple law enforcement agencies.

Why ALICE?



- Developed by a police officer and elementary school principal (husband and wife) to improve school safety
- Currently used by:
 - 4,600 schools3,300 Police Departments4,000 Businesses


Why ALICE?



•ALICE teaches individuals to be active participants in their own safety, while leading others to safety when possible

 Although no program can guarantee success in this type of situation, these new protocols will increase the odds of survival in this type of emergency

What does A.L.I.C.E. stand for?






Where are we?

Current Intruder on Campus

- Lock doors
- Lights off
- Hide out of sight

New Intruder on Campus (barricade only)

- Lock doors
- Lights off
- Barricade entry
- Prepare to Counter
- Hide out of sight

New Intruder on Campus (barricade or evacuate)


