- Formative Assessment
 - Formative Assessment is a <u>process</u> used by teachers and students <u>during</u> instruction that provides <u>feedback</u> to <u>adjust</u> ongoing teaching and learning to improve students' achievement of intended instructional outcomes.
 - Daily (not always in gradebook)
 - Planned for (those decided before instruction)
 - Embedded (in curriculum, used to gather data)
 - Informs the "moves" we make as teachers
 - Includes student input
 - Encourages student self-assessment
 - Students take responsibility for their learning

Updates now that we are in 5 Day return

- 5 Day Traditional Return 4th Marking Period
 - Will send out survey on Monday, March 22nd April 1st
 - Will determine if Health & Safety Plan allows for return of students (class sizes)
- Close contact procedures
 - If we find out during school day Student discreetly pulled from class and parents/guardians contacted
 - If we find out outside school Parent will be contacted at home and student stays home before next day









Superintendent Parent Advisory

Mr. & Mrs. Freeman

- Update from Student Services (re: cleaning, reported COVID cases, great job they're doing to regularly address, etc.) -> KEY NOTES: Holicong has 41 total cases to date; overwhelming majority of all cases (reported district-wide) are originating OUTSIDE OF SCHOOL; they discussed 'tracing' procedures which are being done on a county/state level (not by the district); since start of the new year... there have been a total of 14 "ACTIONABLE" cases in the district (i.e. requiring comprehensive bldg & targeted cleaning

- Staff vaccinations

- 3400 total staff "all-in" inclusive of support staff, substitute teachers, aids, coaches, maintenance support, etc.
- at this point in time it is NOT MANDATORY that staff receive vaccinations; based on last district-wide survey there were only +/- 200 staff NOT INTERESTED in receiving
- they will continue surveying... as some staff are getting vaccinations through other means
- district is being allocated +/- 800 J&J vaccines -- as you're probably aware being administered @ Bucks Cty Intermediate Unit through 3/13









Superintendent Parent Advisory Mr. & Mrs. Freeman

- Policy Impacts

- Masks & social distancing will continue to be required
- They will adjust policy as needed relative to CDC, state guidelines, etc.
- Hopeful to return to "normalization" within 6-17 month range (my note: I'm think beginning in Sept / new school year)
- Looking to have graduations, possibility of field days, etc. -- as such questions were raised by some parents
- If you, your staff or parents have questions -- they reiterated to have them contact the the superintendent and his staff, etc -- who would be happy to address
- Budget Discussion
- Elem. education presentation on Science curriculum/activities









- Q: Will students get NHS credit for helping with Math Counts?
- A: We do not currently have this club at Holicong but if East students helped with this or the tutoring program (or other clubs) we would sign off on this if approved by the CB East NHS.
- Q: How much instructional time will be interrupted by the extended PSSA testing window? How will you operate school with virtual kids needing to test in school but needing to keep social distance?
- A: Covered earlier in Guidance information.
- A: We are waiting for the official numbers of virtual students taking the test and will determine logistics for testing.









- Q: Is there an option for students to change their virtual to in-person learning in the 4th marking period?
- A: This was covered in more detail during the Health & Safety portion of the presentation. Look for survey on Monday!
- Q: Is there a late bus for after school activities?
- A: The district does not have this. This was covered in more detail during the Student Activities portion of the presentation (but relevant to other students as well) and context provided.
- Q: Can students stay after for activities?
- A: Not at this time. This was covered in more detail during the Athletics portion of the presentation (but relevant to other students as well) and context provided.









- Q: If a student does not make an athletic team can they join track after?
- A: Yes! Students would reach out to Coach Barno if that is the case.
- Q: Can students still join clubs?
- A: Yes! This was covered in more detail in the Student Activities portion of the presentation. Students can reach out to club advisors and check the daily announcements for meeting information.
- Q: How does the rolling total for Positive Cases?

- Q: If staff refuse vaccine are they permitted to work from home or do they take leave?
- A: This was covered at the night presentation.
- There is no mandate that all staff members must receive a vaccination. If teachers are working from home they will have a TA in the classroom and still do all lesson planning and teaching of lessons.
- Q: Are parents notified of positive cases of teachers and students?
- A: This was covered at the night presentation.
- No. Due to confidentiality, we do not release the names of the individuals.
 We reviewed the process for close contacts during the Health & Safety presentation.

- Q: Are graded tests (science and math) sent home for parent review?
- A: Assessments are reviewed with students and most are sent home for review. For certain district assessments (finals, midterms) and other summative assessments (possible cores) these are case by case basis by department and if a parent reaches out to the teacher, arrangements will be made for review at the request of a parent.
 - Note covered in previous meetings and with our 9th grade Student Council representatives at 6th grade parent orientation said many assessments are competed on Canvas and have access/reviewed soon after.









- Q: Will students that missed keystone testing during 19-20 school year have to take it this year?
- A: No, an important change is the passage of <u>Senate Bill 1216</u>, which delayed Keystone Exams as a graduation requirement until the class of 2023. It also states that any student who was scheduled to sit for a Keystone exam in Spring 2019-2020 will not be required to make it up and will be deemed proficient (as long as they passed the subject area course).









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
