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Overview: Participate in Read to Self for 10 to 15 minutes (optional: assess reading fluency using EARS fluency rubric). Est. Time: 15 Minutes *Explanation:* Students will read independently for 10 to 15 minutes. Things to Know Independent Reading 1. Choose "just right" books to read from home. "Just right books" are books your child can read and comprehend independently. OR Use https://getepic.com (Class Code: zew4315) 2. Tasks 1. Students will select a 3 to 5 "just right" books to read. 2. Read independently for 10-15 minutes. Your child can whisper read (saying the words quietly aloud) or silently read. 3. Optional: Choose one book to read aloud. Use the EARS "Kid_Friendly_Fluency_Ribric..." to grade yourself on how you sounded while reading. (Use one rubric all week. You can score yourself in different colors each day to see how you are improving throughout the week.) **Overview:** Students will practice describing a family member using character traits. Est. Time: 30 Minutes *Explanation:* Students will review the term character traits and how to identify traits using text clues, and then choose one family member to describe using 3 or more character traits. Things to Know 1. Your child will use the Seesaw activity April 27 Character Trait Review to listen to instruction. 2. Work will be completed through Seesaw or your child can use the paper "Character Trait Family Member." Reading 3. Your child will need to photograph any work done on paper, and then upload it to Seesaw for teachers to review. Tasks 1. Listen to video instruction on pages 1 - 5. 2. On page 6, listen to me think aloud as I describe someone using character traits. 3. On page 7, listen to directions on how you will complete the activity. 4. On page 8, take picture or upload a photo of ONE family member. Then choose 3 or more character traits to describe that person. 5. On page 9, listen to my final ideas. 6. On page 10, complete the "How much help did I need?" chart to give your teacher insight into how the lesson went at home.

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
