Overview: Grammar Review: Common, Proper, Singular & Plural Nouns

Est. Time: 30 minutes Quick Things to Know:

- 1. Common nouns name a person, place, thing, animal, idea or feeling.
- 2. Proper nouns name a specific person, place, thing, animal, or idea. Proper nouns have a capital letter.
- 3. Singular nouns name ONE person, place, thing while Plural nouns name MORE THAN ONE person, place or thing.

Activity Explanation: Applying reviewed knowledge to various activities in Seesaw.

Task

- 1. Look for Seesaw Activity: First Grade Grammar Review
- 2. Students will watch an instructional video reviewing all types of nouns learned in first grade.
- 3. Students will apply that review to various tasks in the Seesaw Activity on Slides 1-4.

Overview: Practice new first grade spelling words: made, more, knew, water, nice, people, can't, don't

Est. Time: 15 minutes

Explanation: Practice accurately spelling the new first grade word wall words provided this week by selecting one or two different activities on the "Word Work Activities" list.

Quick Things to Know:

- 1. First graders will now receive 8 new words every 2 weeks. Since students are not graded for Spelling on the report card, there will not be any formal Friday Spelling Tests.
- 2. If your child masters the 8 new words, consider practicing the words on the inside cover of your child's green Word Work Homework Book or any other 1st & 2nd Trimester words that have been tricky for your child.
- 3. Do not choose more than 7 to 10 words to practice a day. Our memory struggles to recall more than 7 to 10 unique pieces of information at a time.

Task

- 2. Choose one or two activities from the "Word Work Activities" list.
- 3. Practice spelling words accurately.

Overview: Participate in Read to Self for 10 to 15 minutes (optional: Nonfiction text feature hunt).

Est. Time: 15 Minutes

Explanation: Students will read independently for 10 to 15 minutes.

Things to Know

1. Choose "just right" books to read from home. "Just right books" are books your child can read and comprehend independently.

2. Use https://getepic.com (Class Code: zew4315)

Tasks

Independent Reading

- 1. Students will select a 3 to 5 "just right" books to read.
- 2. Read independently for 10-15 minutes. Your child can whisper read (saying the words quietly aloud) or silently read.

Optional: Students can use the document "Nonfiction Text Feature Hunt" when reading a nonfiction book, magazine, article, or website (i.e. Pebble Go) to notice and identify different nonfiction text features.

Overview: Students will notice nonfiction text features and then use text features to answer questions about the topic of the text.

Est. Time: 30 Minutes

Explanation: Students will identify and use nonfiction text features to answer questions about skin and sunburns.

- 1. Your child will use the Seesaw activity **Day 1 Using Nonfiction Text Features to Understand a Text** to listen to instruction.
- 2. Work will be completed through Seesaw or your child can log into <u>Scholastic News</u> to complete page 4 of the May/June issue title *Do Pigs Wear Sunscreen?* Then your child will need to take a screenshot or photo of their work to upload on Seesaw.
- 3. Scholastic News Class Code: 1melvin

Tasks

- 1. Listen to video instruction on pages 1 7.
- 2. On page 8, it's your turn to identify and use nonfiction text features to answer questions about skin and sunburns. Students can use the caption button to listen to the questions again.
- 3. On pages 9, listen to my final ideas.
- 4. On page 10, students find out how to explore the magazine and topic further.
- 5. On page 11, complete the "How much help did I need?" chart to give your teacher insight into how the lesson went at home.

Estimated Time: 60 minutes


