

Grade K: May 14, 2020 RELA LESSON Character Study

Reading/Language Arts



Overview: This week we are going to complete a character study on a fun character in one of Tomie dePaolo's books.

Things to know:

1. Sit with mom, dad, grandparent or guardian, or your brother or sister to practice the activities for the day.
2. If you do not have the supplied worksheets or access to any of the worksheets, it is fine to create your own based off the supplied worksheets.
3. This week's lesson for reading and writing, we responded to characters within the story.
4. Today will be going to play a sight word game and identify the characters within a story of your choice on Raz-Kids.

Explanation: Today you are going to review vocabulary sight words by playing a game and reading a book on Raz-Kids.

	Resources
1.Review Sight word games	<p>The words we focused on this week within our story were * was * said.</p> <p>Choose at least 10 more words to practice.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Remember to ask Mom/Dad BEFORE playing any of these games and using any of the material suggested. Thanks! <p>Here is a game you can play. <i>Sight Word Cup Game:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Write 1 sight word from our K 40 word list on the bottom or side of a paper cup.• Grab some pom poms or small toys (ask first) and have an older sibling or mom/dad hide them under some (not all) cups.• Try to find ALL the toys by reading the word before turning it over.• Did you do it? Did you find all the objects? Nice job!!

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Challenge: You can use the sight word in a complete sentence before turning over the cup. • Have fun! <p>Here is an example of the game:</p> 
<p>2.Review Another Sight word game to play</p>	<p>Another sight word game you could play: 2 people game:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Each player has an equal number of cups. • Write a different sight word on the bottom or side of each cup if plastic. • When it is your turn, read the word. If you do so correctly, begin to stack your cups in any design you chose. If you do not get the word correct, you do not stack your cup until your next turn. • See how high you can stack your cups before they run out! How many words can you read independently? • Have Fun <p>See picture example:</p> 
<p>3.Do: Raz-Kids Reading</p>	<p>Go on Raz-Kids and chose any story you would like to read. If you are having difficulty reading the book, you can choose the option to have it read to you. Enjoy!</p>

4 . Extra Practice	You can create a character profile (sheets emailed to your parents earlier this week- or just use a regular piece of paper) and complete it for a character in one of the Raz-Kids book you read.
5.How is this assignment turned into the teacher?	No work needs to be submitted for this assignment. Just have fun playing a sight word game and reading a Raz-Kid book. We can also “conference” about your work if you are having difficulty during my “office hours”. Thank you
6. Independent Reading	Remember to independently read today. You could choose a book you know how to read all by yourself, curl up in a comfy place in your house and read to a favorite stuffed friend.
