Thursday, March 19, 2020 Kindergarten Reading

Overview: Read the Poem "Jump and Jiggle." Identify the action words/verbs and act them out. Complete the Family Reading Activity Page that goes with the poem. Pick a favorite fiction book and read it in a new location in which you have never before read. Read over the Talking Points below and have an adult ask you the comprehension questions.

Estimated Time: Approximately 30-40 minutes

Explanation: You will complete a phonics/ reading poem and a fun reading activity in a new location. You will use the Talking Points I suggested to guide your book discussion with an adult or older sibling after you read. You will illustrate your favorite part of the story you read and be able to explain verbally "why" it is your favorite part.

Things to know:

- 1. Take out the poem "Jump and Jiggle" from your Grab Bag. Sit with mom, dad, grandparent or guardian, or your brother or sister and read the poem together. Re-read it and identify any words you do not know the meaning. Look the unknown words up with an adult or have the adult tell you the meaning.
- 2. Find a new Fiction Book at home to read.
- 3. Pick a location inside or outside to read that you have never read in before to challenge yourself to try something new.

Tasks:

- 1. Phonics: Read the "Jump and Jiggle" poem found in your Grab Bag with an adult or older sibling as usual. Act out all the verbs/ action words in the poem and have an adult/older sibling watch you. They can join you if they want:) Try to stretch out the sounds to one or two unknown words and learn to read these new words. Complete the Family Questions as always with the help of an adult or older sibling. If it is taking too much time, take a break and return to it at a later time.
- 2. **Reading**: Pick a new location inside or outside your house in which you have never read. Read today's book in your new location. Pick a favorite book or a new book you want to read. Think about all the authors we have read in class and maybe read a new book by a favorite author. An adult may read it with/to you. Make sure you use the strategy of pointing to each word as you read. Remember to also stretch the sounds in unknown words to help you read them. Read over the Talking Points below and have an adult ask you comprehension questions about the book you read.

Talking Points:

- * Identify the 5 Story Elements in the story- Characters, Setting, Beginning, Middle, and End.
- * Answer WH questions to reinforce story details.

Hope you had a great time completing the Jump and Jiggle poem and reading a Fiction Book in a new location today. (3)

How is this assignment turned in to the teacher:
