Overview:

As you know, April is Poetry Month. Our Reading and Writing theme this week is Poetry and Rhyming Words. Today we continue to build on our knowledge of reading and writing rhyming words.

We will also complete a Reading Sort from our Good Habits, Great Readers Reading Program as part of our ongoing Phonics work.

Things to know:

1.Sit with mom, dad, grandparent or guardian, or your brother or sister to complete the activities for today.

2. Take out sort **#16** from your Distance Learning Envelope.

3. If you do not have the supplied sort, it is fine to create your own.

4. Are you in your comfortable learning space? Do you have your pencil case and scissors with you? Grab your favorite stuffed animal to watch you and a snack to enjoy as you work.

Explanation:

Today we will explore rhyming words using a strategy called the Rhyming Family House. All the words that can live in each house must rhyme. You know that means they sound the same at the end. For example, we know that if we have the "ig" Family House the words big, wig, pig, dig, and jig can live in it because they all sound the same at the end. Words like mom and dad cannot live in the "ig" Family House because they do not rhyme with "ig." To help us identify and hear beginning sounds in words we will complete a phonics sort. We will focus on letters Bb, Mm, Rr, and Ss and their sounds. Changing beginning sounds in rhyming families helps us learn to read new words. You are experts at this activity so I know it will be "easy peasy" for you. Pat yourself on the back for doing your best work today. Smile with pride

Tasks	Resources
1.Lesson Introduction : Remember and think about the poem, "Little Bo Peep."	We love to read poems in class and talk about the words that rhyme. Rhyming is a great reading strategy to help us learn how to read new words. Review the Little Bo Peep poem you worked on yesterday. Remember we talked about the "eep" rhyming family. In the poem we found 2 words that rhymes with "eep." Whisper what they aredid you say peep and sheep? Can you think of a new word or two that rhymes with "eep" and can live in the "eep" family house?

3. Do: Create your own Rhyming Family House.	Look at this picture below of two Rhyming Family Houses. Read the name of each family. One is the "at" family, and one is the "ed" family. Read the rhyming words that can live in each house. Explain to mom or day or the person helping you the reason these words can live in the house. Use your brain to think of 3 more words that can live in each house. Say them out loud and then write them on a piece of paper. Sit up nice and tall and use your best handwriting. See picture below:

6. Try: Extra Practice Reading	Find a rhyming book at home to read to your favorite stuffed animal. Dr. Seuss books are great rhyming books. You pick the location to read today. Your choice! Is there a special cozy spot you love inside or outside of your house? Use Bookflix to find a book if you do not have a rhyming book at home. Have fun!
