Reading/Language Arts

Overview: non-fiction books, Non-fiction books are based facts, real events or real people. Today we are going to

continue our reading/writing lesson on the topic of butterflies

Things to know:

1. Sit with mom, dad, grandparent or guardian, or your brother or sister to practice the activities for the day.
2. If you do not have the supplied worksheets or access to any of the worksheets, it is fine to create your own based off the supplied worksheets.
3. This week's lesson for reading and writing, will be on a non-fiction book.
The book will be about butterflies.
4. We will focus on specific sight words, listen/read a story and then have a response.

Look at the color of the pictures, the background, what else is in the picture? Have you ever taken a picture of a butterfly? Now that the weather is getting warmer, we should start to see butterflies.</p>
<p>4. Writing: Complete non-fiction chalk drawing.</p>	<p>Practice writing the words: fiction and nonfiction. You do not need to submit this writing assignment for this lesson. You can practice writing with chalk, you can practice writing in shaving cream, or you can air write the words.</p>
<p>5. Extra Practice: Writing and Reading</p>	<p>1-Draw a picture of a butterfly in their real environment. Did you use detail in your drawing like the detail in the photographs? Did you draw the chrysalis hanging on a tree branch?</p>
<p>6. How is this assignment turned into the teacher?</p>	<p>You do not need to submit any written work today for this assignment. Just be sure to have a conversation about the details in the photographs in a nonfiction book. We can also “conference”</p>

	about your work if you are having difficulty during my “office hours”. Thank you
7. Independent Reading	Remember to independently read today. You could choose a book you know how to read all by yourself, curl up in a comfy place in your house and read to a favorite stuffed friend.
