Please read this story to your child first, pointing to the words as you read. Then have your child read it to you (3)

The goal of this book is to:

- · Point to each word with an index finger as it is being read (this promotes 1 to 1 correspondence with words)
- · Practice reading high frequency words like, is, my- in **My House** and Here, play, and- in Playtime.
- · Gain a positive view of themselves as a reader

Some additional notes/activities with this book:

- · If any page is tricky and does not follow the pattern, you may have to read this page several times to your child before they can do it themselves.
- · It is okay if your child begins to memorize this book. That is the early stages of reading.

	· When they are done reading you can go back to a page and say "find the word…" and ask them to find one of the high frequency words.
	· You can also have them write several high frequency words after they are done reading the book. Make sure they practice correct spelling when writing these words.
