Grade Kindergarten Reading and Language Arts Monday, June 1, 2020

Overview: We will use Leveled Books like we use during our Guided Reading lessons in school to review and work on our reading strategies. We will focus on several sight words, read and think about a prompt for writing, and write a story response.

Things to Know:

- 1. Work with mom, dad, grandparent or guardian, or your older brother or sister to enjoy the reading and writing activities today.
- 2. Today we will read two leveled books and practice our reading skills. We will read **Me and My Dog** and **Jack's Birthday**.
- 3. We will practice several of our sight words that are in the stories.
- 4. We will write a story response and recognize the amazing growth we are making!
- 5. We will play a reading game.
- 6. Have fun learning and showing off your reading independence!

Hi Kindergarten Families,

Please read this story to your child first, pointing to the words as you read. Then have your child read it to you [3]

The goal of this book is to:

- · Point to each word with an index finger as it is being read (this promotes 1 to 1 correspondence with words)
- · Practice reading high frequency words –Here, Look, Me/me in Me and My Dog and

can, see, the in Jack's Birthday.

· Gain a positive view of themselves as a reader

Some additional notes/activities with this book:

- \cdot If any page is tricky and does not follow the pattern, you may have to read this page several times to your child before they can do it themselves.
- · It is okay if your child begins to memorize this book. That is the early stages of reading.
- · When they are done reading you can go back to a page and say "find the word..." and ask them to find one of the high frequency words.

	· You can also have them write several high frequency words after they are done reading the book. Make sure they practice correct spelling when writing these words.


Stretch the Letter Sounds and Read the Word


Look at the "Stretching Letter Sounds" Game below. There are 2 game sheets. You do not have to complete both at the same time. We have played this game in class, and you will have fun playing it at home.

- 1.In each box you will see a 3 sound word that begins with a consonant, has a vowel in the middle, and ends with a consonant. *All vowel sounds in these words are the short vowel sounds. *Remember that we read from left to right as the arrow shows, so move your finger from left to right.
- 2. Put your finger on the dot under the first letter where it says "start." Say the sound of that letter.
- 3. Then move your finger to the dot under the middle letter and say that letter sound.
- 4. Finally, move your finger to the dot under the last letter and say that letter sound.
- 5.Now put all three sounds together and read the word! WOW You did it (3)
- 6. Repeat with each word. Use the second page after you take a brain break later today or another day.
- 7. **Optional Fun Addition** Use a colorful game piece mover you have at home and move the piece forward each time you child read the word. Sing your favorite song when you get to the last word on the page (3)
