

# Grade Kindergarten- Tuesday, April 7, 2020

## Social Studies

**Overview:** Our Social Studies unit this month is The Farm and Farm Animals. We will be start by exploring Farm Animals: their names, the sounds they make, characteristics of each animal, what they do on the farm, and what they add to our lives. Today, we are going to read a book about the farm called, Animal Babies written by Elaine Pascoe.

### Things to Know:

1. Sit with mom, dad, grandparent or guardian, or your older brother or sister to enjoy the activities.
2. You will create your own worksheet today by using a piece of paper, crayons, and a pencil.
3. This week's lesson for Social Studies will be identifying some animals that live on a farm and the names of their babies. We will use the information in the book Animal Babies by Elaine Pascoe to help us.

5. Try to remember when our class read Mrs. Wishy Washy together. We loved trying to read the animal names, and most of us needed to look at the pictures for clues. Now that we have all become super readers, it is going to be easy for us to read the animal names ourselves! We are becoming independent readers!

<p><b>Lesson Introduction:</b> Introduce the animals in the book. Encourage students to practice writing the animal names.</p>	<p>Introduction of animal names. These are words to focus on during this lesson:</p> <p>cow          horse          elephant          lion          swan</p> <p>llama          seal          Kangaroo</p> <p>Practice reading the animal names and then writing them on a sheet of paper that you have at home. Any paper will work, or you can use a chalkboard or white board.</p>
<p><b>1. Learn:</b> Listen to the story called Animal Babies.</p>	<p>Log on to Bookflix using the log on information, username, and password located in the “Things to Know” section above. Listen to the story. Read along with me 😊</p>
<p><b>2. Try: You are a Farmer today!</b></p>	<p>Tell a parent, sibling or a stuffed friend what animals you saw and read about in the book, Animal Babies. Remember to start by using a full sentence, “In the story I saw ...”. Think about it. Have you ever visited a farm to see the animals? What is the same about the animals you read about in today’s story? What is different?</p>
<p><b>3. Do: Pair/Share</b> Discuss three animals you learned about in the book with the adult helping you. Identify the name of the animal and one thing you learned about it.</p>	<p>Discuss 3 animals that you saw in the book with the adult helping you. Share your brainstorm ideas about the animals you both want to share.</p> <p>Using a blank piece of paper draw a picture of your favorite animal and write its name next to it. Remember to label your picture and/or complete this sentence starter: My favorite animal on the farm is...</p>

<b>4. Extra Practice:</b> Draw a picture. Write a sentence.	1-You could draw a picture of a farm today. Remember to include some animals that you like to see. What else do you see on a farm? 2. You could visit the “Philadelphia Zoo Live at 2” website and watch the daily lesson and see real animals at the zoo.
