Expectations and Responsibilities Tamanend Band Students

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Welcome back! I hope your summer vacation finds you energized and ready for another exciting year of music making. I plan to make this year rewarding, challenging, productive, and of the utmost, FUN. Below are listed expectations and responsibilities for all band students, which are essential in making this year run as smooth as possible. Read through this paper thoroughly with your parents. Make sure you understand what is expected of you; be sure your parents know what is expected of you. If you or your parents have any questions, please feel free to contact me.

There is nothing listed below that is expected of you that is beyond reason. I will do my best to lead by example through demonstrating honesty, integrity, courtesy, fairness, consistency, caring, and respect. By following these few guidelines, you will help in making our class time valuable and fun.

Course Expectations:

Each student is expected to:

- A. Arrive to class on time with his/her <u>instrument</u>, <u>music folder with music</u> enclosed (which will be provided), and <u>pencil</u> (which each student will need to provide).
- B. Attend <u>all</u> pre-announced scheduled rehearsals and performances; this includes all *after-school rehearsals* held until 4:00, *parades* and *concerts*. After-school rehearsals will be announced several weeks prior to the first rehearsal to ensure pre-planned pick-up or carpool plans for the students.
- C. Practice on a regular basis outside of class; I recommend a minimum of 20 minutes, 3 times per week. Students will also be expected to take their instruments home over long-weekends and holidays.
- D. Take care of YOUR OWN instrument; do not attempt to handle/play anyone else's instrument but your own!!
- E. Treat others the way you would like to be treated; courtesy and respect are a must.
- F. Come to class willing to learn, and use your time wisely.

Responsibilities of the Students:

I. Equipment

- A. Have an I.D. Tag on your instrument case with your first and last name and band period printed clearly on it. Masking tape can be used if you have lost your tag.
- B. Maintain proper care of your instrument. Notify Mr. Werner as soon as a problem arises; do not wait and potentially make the problem worse.
- C. Return all instruments, mallets/sticks, and music folders to their proper "homes" at the end of each class period and after-school rehearsal.

II. Rehearsals and Performances

- A. Check the schedule posted on both "announcement boards" in the front of the band room for rehearsal dates and times <u>every Monday morning</u>. *DO NOT RELY SOLEY ON MORNING ANNOUNCEMENTS FOR SCHEDULED REHEARSAL REMINDERS*.
- B. Arrive on time for all rehearsals and performances, to maximize the limited time we have to rehearse as a full ensemble.
- C. A written excuse from a parent or guardian is required when a rehearsal or concert will be missed. All excuses should be turned in <u>prior</u> to the concert or rehearsal that is to be excused.
- D. An excuse note is not required when a student is absent from school, sent home early, or in the event of conflicting Tamanend games/functions occurring simultaneously.
 - 1. Examples of acceptable excused absences from rehearsals may include, but are not limited to, Tamanend sporting events (game or meet), doctor's appointment or note from doctor concerning injury.
 - 2. Excuses such as tiredness, excess homework, haircuts, work and "I Forgot" will not be excused, <u>resulting in a grade of a "0" for the rehearsal</u>. The schedule is posted in advance, so the student has time to plan for the rehearsal.
- E. If there is an after-school conflict between band rehearsals (does not include concerts) and Tamanend sports <u>practices</u>, the student is to notify both the coach and Mr. Werner in advance and to COME TO THE MUSIC REHEARSAL <u>FIRST</u> FULLY DRESSED FOR THEIR AFTER-SCHOOL SPORTS PRACTICE. The student will rehearse with the band and will be dismissed early, at 3:30, to attend the remainder of their sports practice, which usually lasts until 5:00. Remember that attendance of after-school rehearsals is part of your grade and will hurt your grade if they are skipped or unexcused.
- F. All concerts are mandatory.
 Since band class is a performance-based curriculum, students are expected to perform in the two evening concerts during the school year.

 **Check your calendars now!

If the student needs to be excused from the Winter Concert <u>a note needs to be written separately and handed in by the end of September</u>. All late requests will need to be handled through Mr. Werner by the parent or guardian directly.

III. Conduct

- A. Respect must be a foremost in the band room, and in the auditorium. I will not talk or play any instrument when you are talking, and I will ask the same of you when another student or myself is talking.
- B. No eating, drinking, or gum chewing will be permitted in the band room or in the auditorium. Not only can this cause harm to you and your instrument, but this is also a school policy.

Grades will be determined by:

Summative Assessment (90%)

- Individual Rehearsal Performance Skills
- Playing tests on concert music, scales, and exercises handed out in class
- Perform Spring Concert music at competition level, as we will be using it to compete in the PMEA Performance Assessment at CB East High School
- Attendance of all rehearsals and performances outside of the school day (unless excused before-hand)
