Have Balance: What is the truth? Truth is a balance of two aspects – reason and intuition. Build your arguments/decisions with this in mind.

Learn Actively: This course is “No Deposit, No Return” – you will get out of it only what you put in. Remember that learning is not free; the cost is your involvement in the process.
