Problem - disease born from poor water and sewage. Solution- City governments devise sewage and water systems.


Problem- City governments become corrupt with power Solution- Pendleton Act passed to regulate city governr

Railroads and Monopolies:

Pre-Civil War: Expansion Westward was limited due to no Transcontinental RR.

Post Civil War: Government begins to grant land and subsidies to Private RR companies to encourage expansion.

Why the Wizard of Oz was a "dream" and not a reality.

- 1. Non farmer members became turned off by the radical nature of the party.
- 2. Black and white farmers couldn't overcome racism to unite.
- 3. Democratic party "stole" some of its more moderate members
- 4. Sectional differences created different strategies.
- 5. Couldn't win a significant election.

Significance of the Election of 1896

Rep. William McKinley defeats Dem. William Jennings Bryan.

- 1. Highlights the division between rural and urban interests.
- 2. Demonstrates shift of power from agrarian interests to industrialized interests.
- 3. Solidifies the Two part system.
