Honors Global Relations Central Bucks High School West

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Course Description:

This eighteen-week course introduces students to the fields of international relations and global economics. In particular, students will examine many of the most important issues confronting the world today and come to understand how events in one country affect many other countries and sometimes the entire world; additionally, students will be challenged to consider multiple perspectives on global issues and problems, preparing them for informed citizenship in the world community.

Units of study will examine the following themes and topics (order subject to change):

Unit 1: Introduction to International Relations (2 weeks)

Unit 2: The Behavior of States (2 weeks)

Unit 3: The U.S. Role in the World (2 weeks)

Unit 4: The United Nations and Human Rights (3 weeks)

Unit 5: National Security Issues (3 weeks)

Unit 6: The Global Economy (2.5 weeks)

Core Assessment 1 (1.5 weeks) Core Assessment 2 (2 weeks)

Grading Breakdown (Marking Period):

- Summative: 90%
 - O To be administered regularly throughout the duration of the course. Assessment format will vary but ultimately seek to evaluate the degree of student learning. Examples include tests, quizzes, projects, and essays, among others.
- Formative: 10%

You can expect to do any or all of the following when assigned a reading: read and take notes (RTN); produce a formal outline that highlights your engagement with the text; complete a guided reading worksheet or graphic organizer; answer guiding questions. You can expect that homework will be spot-checked, collected individually or at the end of a given unit of study, and/or evaluated in the form of a reading quiz (for which the use of said homework will be permitted). In short, be prepared to read, write, and discuss in class — even online!
