Welcome to SAT Math prep. The purpose of this course is to prepare you to take the math portion of the Scholastic Achievement Test (SAT). Topics that will be covered include: arithmetic review, algebra review, geometry review, probability and data interpretation.

CLASS PROCEDURES

- 1. Required materials for class include the workbook (**\$20**), notebook (3-ring is recommended), pen or pencil, and calculator. You may use a graphing calculator; I have some that may be used during class. You must have collateral to borrow a calculator. If you are going to purchase a graphing calculator, stick to the TI-84 family. Bring all of these materials to class every day.
- 2. Every Friday we will take a practice SAT (math sections only.) Make sure you bring a **non-mechanical** pencil and your calculator for these practice tests.
- 3. Each homework or classwork assignment will be graded as either 10, 5, or 0 points out of 10: 10 points for full credit, 5 for partial credit, 0 for no credit.

GRADING

- 60%: Homework/Classwork
- 20%: Practice Tests
- 20%: College Research Assignment
