# The Project:

Individually you will choose a U.S. National Park (possibly other countries) which interests you and is relevant to this course. You will act as a park ranger that is representing a certain national park. You must check with Mr. Walsh about the park to get approval, suggestions, etc. You may also request help in finding sources of information, either from Mr. Walsh or with a librarian. Your textbook also contains citations to excellent literature. I would recommend looking at pictures in the text to brain storm

You will be allotted time in class to do research on your project your primary resource will be your laptops but there are other resources. If time is being wasted, I will deduct points from your overall presentation grade.

# Length, Content and Format:

- 3. You are required to turn in a 500 word paper along with an effective computer presentation with visual and audio components.

- 5. The paper will be font 12, double spaced and 1 inch margins, you may use whatever style you are most comfortable with when writing your paper but must site all references used (in a bibliographic list with correct format) at the end of your paper, this is not optional.
- 6. The Content, this area should include pictures, diagrams (presentation only not paper) and valuable information that makes your park unique, items that you must address:
  - 1. Name and location of park, (include a map)
  - 2. Why you chose the park
  - 3. Topographic Map Google Earth or <u>http://www.gmap-pedometer.com/</u>
  - 4. Geology of park-How was your park created? (this should be the most in-depth of topics!) Should include:
    - a. Plate Tectonic activity (earthquakes/volcanoes)
    - b. Erosion activity (rivers, glaciers)
    - c. What kind of rocks and minerals can we find in your park?
    - d. What environmental factors are affecting the park (air, water, soil pollution)?
    - e. What watersheds are found in the park?
  - 5. History- How did it become a national park and why?
  - 6. What kind of recreational activities occur in your park?
  - 7. What kind of biological activity occurs in the park?
  - 8. Tourist information...
  - 9. Two news articles where your park made the news
  - 10. Remember you are marketing the park, what makes your park special?
- 7. The presentation is to be 7-10 minutes in length. The paper and presentation should have originality of thought and synthesis of information from multiple sources, as well as elegance and clarity of expression. Please dress professionally. I do not want you to read in front of the class from note cards, what are the keys to an effective presentation?
- 8. This project will be used in place of a final exam, it is very important that you take the time to prepare a good product as you would for any test. If you have any questions, please see me.
