Proper equipment is required at all times (rental available), and a Hold Harmless form must be completed. Anyone 17 years or younger must have a parent signed liability waiver on file, having been signed in the presence of a Member Services staff member. All users of the Skatepark must sign come in and sign a waiver. Parents must sign for those under 18 years of age. If you do not have a current waiver on file you will not be admitted to the Skate Park.

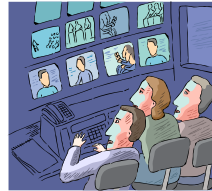

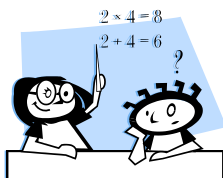

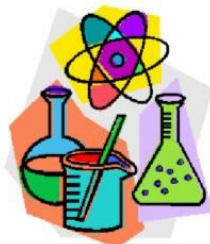

- 2:30 – report to cafeteria
- 2:45 – tour busses leave Lenape
- 4:30 – arrival at Blue Mountain
- 5:00 – students take mandatory lesson on first outing
- 9:45 – students return to lodge
- 10:00 – students must be in lodge – prepare to depart
- 10:15 – busses leave Blue Mountain
- 11:45 – arrival at Lenape

Cost of the program is: **\$246** for lift pass and transportation (no lesson; experienced only)  
**\$311** for lift pass, transportation and six lessons  
**\$311** for lift, rental equip., and transportation (no lesson; exp. only)  
**\$356** for lift, rental equipment, transportation and six lessons  
**\$30** for helmet rental for all six days  
**\$30** for single lesson on the first day (required for beginners + novices)

**Registration will begin following the mandatory meeting in late September or early October. Parents (guardians) and students must attend one of the mandatory meetings. The meetings will be in the Lenape Auditorium.** You must attend **one** of the meetings to register and participate with the snow sports club each year. Registrations and payments will be accepted at the conclusion of each meeting and in school (room 340) beginning Oct. 9. The deadline for registration is Friday, Oct. 20 or when all available seats are full.
