On October 18th, 100 students from the 9th grade class got a chance to go to New York City. The students got the option of going to the United Nations or the Natural History Museum. Afterwards, students explored the National September 11th Memorial and Battery Park.

Next, we went to the National September 11th Memorial and Battery Park. From the park we could see Elis Island and the Statue of Liberty, which was the first time I had seen it. After spending a little longer there, we boarded the bus and made our way home.

50 students also visited the United Nations or UN, where they took a tour through the headquarters. It was humbling to know that some of the most powerful leaders in the world had met where I was standing to converse about peace and international conflict. There also was a gift shop and food court, which featured world cuisine and signature country items. I tried the sushi which, note to self, was not very good, but I did hear the dumplings were good. I especially loved the breathtaking views of the towering buildings of Brooklyn across East River.

On the trip we also got to see the 9/11 memorial in Manhattan. There were 2 reflection pools in the park, where the Twin Towers once stood, which left many students touched by the courage rescuers, victims, families, and citizens demonstrated on September 11, 2001. We also saw the only surviving tree left after the tragedy, a symbol for hope and unity in America.

Battle of the Fall: Apple Music or Spotify? Both costs \$9.99 per month... which should you use?

Apple Music

Apple music is better than Spotify if you're into exclusive music and sharing your own music. Apple gives you a free three month trial to see if you like it or not. It also allows you access to 30 million songs, which is the same as Spotify. Except Spotify only gives a 30 day trial, and it costs the same as Apple Music. And if you are a musician wanting to share your music to the world, Apple Music is accepting submissions, and it even tells you how to get started. It also has exclusive artists you can't find on Spotify. Apple Music, as of September 2016, is reported to have at least 17 million subscribers! Although that is less than Spotify's paid user base, it's impressive when you consider that Apple Music went live in June of 2015, nine years after Spotify did.



When it comes to subscribers, the undisputed king of ondemand music is Spotify. It has way more subscribers than Apple Music—a whopping 55 million. The advantage? It is the only service allowed to stream free, on-demand music with advertising. So even though you can pay \$9.99 for an ad-free premium membership, over 66 percent of Spotify's overall users don't pay the premium membership. You can also create playlists and share them with friends, or have people follow you and your playlists. So, if you're looking for the best user experience and communities, Spotify is where you should put your money.

Protests by the Southeastern Pennsylvania Transportation Authority (SEPTA) workers have caused people in Philadelphia to have to scramble to find ways to travel. The protests began on Tuesday, November 1st. Buses, trolleys, and subways that provide about 900,000 rides a day stopped running. The workers are part of a union, or a group of organized workers who join together to have their voices heard. They are fighting for things such as better health care and higher wages. SEPTA said it is hopeful that an agreement will be reached before Election Day, November 8th. They were right! On November 7th, just in time for election day, SEPTA members placed an injunction on their strike, finally allowing travelers to... well, travel again.



Last year, a war started in Yemen, a country in Western Asia, between forces loyal to the internationally-recognized government of President Abdrabbuh Mansour Hadi and those allied to the Houthi rebel movement. This ongoing conflict has left thousands

dead as the Saudi-led coalition continues its defense against Houthi rebels.



This battle has left many food shortages. The UN program says that they need more than \$257 million to give food assistance until March. Ishan, a 26-year-old mother, told the World Food Program that she borrowed money from neighbors to take her malnourished son to a hospital.

Of her son, Ishan says, "he is slipping away from us and losing more weight every day. I hardly have food to feed my children, let alone to eat well."

What you can do to help: Visit savethechildren.org, the first international group in Yemen which works to promote children's rights with programs in education, protection, and survival.

RECIPE OF THE SEASON:

Pumpkin Chocolate Chip Squares

■ These moist pumpkin bars studded with chocolate ■ chips are simply irresistible.

Ingredients:

- 2 cups all-purpose flour, (spooned and leveled)
- ¹1 tablespoon pumpkin-pie spice
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 3/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup (2 sticks) unsalted butter, room temperature
- 1 1/4 cups sugar
- 1 large egg
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 1 cup canned pumpkin
 - puree
 - 1 package (12 ounces)
- semisweet chocolate
- chips

Instructions:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Line bottom and sides of a 9-by-13-inch baking pan with foil.

In a medium bowl, whisk together flour, pie spice, baking soda, and salt; set aside.

With an electric mixer, cream butter and sugar until smooth; beat in egg and vanilla until combined. Beat in pumpkin puree.

Mix in dry ingredients until just combined. Fold in chocolate chips.

Spread batter evenly in prepared pan. Bake for 35 to 40 minutes. Cool completely in pan.

Lift cake from pan (using foil as an aid). Peel off foil, and use a serrated knife to cut into 24 squares.
