











## Framing Your Thoughts Reference Sheet

<b>Sentence Frame</b>		A sentence is framed with a capital letter and ends with a stop sign	The dog sleeps.
<b>Subject</b>		Names the person, place or thing sentence is about (Noun)	girl dog he cat we I
<b>Predicate</b>		Tells action of the subject (Verb)	run jumps thinks loves flies
<b>Sentence Formula</b> (Bare bone sentence)		A sentence needs a subject word plus a predicate word.	Birds chirp. Stars twinkle.
<b>Predicate Expanders</b>  *Where *How *When *Why		Expands or tells more about the predicate (Adverbs)	<u>Where</u> - in, out, over, under, beside, along <u>How</u> - ly words, like, as <u>When</u> -since, during, after, yesterday <u>Why</u> -because, so, to, for

<p><b>Connector</b></p>		<p><b>Used with compound subjects or compound predicates</b></p>	<p>and</p>
<p><b>Key point</b></p>		<p><b>A good paragraph is built around one key point.</b></p>	<p>Steel Force is the greatest roller coaster.</p>
<p><b>A paragraph is a group of sentences working together to develop one key point.</b></p>		<p><b>Built around one key point</b></p> <p><b>Key point=topic sentence</b></p> <p><b>Body is made up of supporting sentences to make key point clear and convincing</b></p> <p><b>Ends with a restatement sentence - it closes key point.</b></p>	<p><b>Dogs make great pets. Dogs are good companions. Dogs are loyal. Puppies are entertaining. Dogs are wonderful pets.</b></p>
