#### Task 1

*Writing/*Grammar

(25 minutes)

- Open to the next clean page in your notebook/writing paper.
- Write the date at the top (3-25-20).
- Go back to the **Opinion Writing Menu** in Seesaw and choose a prompt
- Write your opinion at the top of the page for a title.
- Write your response to the prompt below.
- Go back to reread your writing to check that it makes sense.
- Read it again to check for correct capitalization, finger spacing, spelling, and punctuation.

#### Overview

Identify homophones.

**Things to Know:** A homophone is a word that is pronounced the same as another word but differs in meaning. The words may be spelled the same, such as rose (flower) and rose (past tense of "rise"), or differently, such as carat, caret, and carrot, or to, two and too.

#### Task 2

- Find the first packet in your envelope titled **Long a Homophones 1**.
- Tear off the top page.
- Cut the along the dotted lines.
- Sort the words to match each pair of homophones.
- Check with a parent, and then glue the words to the paper.



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#### **Overview**
