

The PSAT/NMSQT at East will be held on Saturday, October 15, 2022. It is open for 10th and 11th grade students. There are no alternative exam dates, and registration is only open to East students. It is just practice for the SAT, therefore scores are not shared with colleges or placed on transcripts. Juniors that take the PSAT are potential candidates for [National Merit Scholarship Consideration](#). For information about PSAT/NMSQT content, visit [CollegeBoard](#) for PSAT general information.

There are a very limited number of seats, so registration will be available until exams are sold out. Please do not wait to register. Registration for the PSAT at CB East will be open on the MyPaymentsPlus (MPP) website (<https://www.mypaymentsplus.com/>) from **Friday, Sept. 9th to Monday, Oct. 3rd**. The registration fee is \$30. If this is the first time you are using MPP for any of your students, then you'll need to create a new account; if you created an account for use with an older sibling, then you'll need to add the new student to your already existing account. You will need your student's school ID to create a new MPP account, or to add a new student to an existing account. There is a "forget your username or password" button if needed, but you should not create a new account if you forget your login information. The PSAT at East will only appear as an activity you can register for after a student at CB East is added to your MPP account.

It is important for students to be on time the morning of the exam- no one will be permitted to enter after testing begins. Students should plan to be in their assigned room by 7:45am and arrange for pickup around 12pm (dismissal time can vary slightly from room to room, but all students will have the same testing time). Students should review the PSAT "[Test Day Checklist](#)" so they can come prepared with all necessary supplies.

While the PSAT/NMSQT is a tool used to prepare for the SAT, there are a number of resources we recommend sophomores and juniors utilize for test prep:

*[College Board](#) website- Taking a full-length SAT practice test is one of the best ways to simulate test day. Eight official SAT practice tests are available for free, both online and on paper. Created by the makers of the SAT, each practice test has the same types of questions you'll see on test day. Six of the practice tests have even previously been given as actual SAT exams.

*Take free SAT practice tests online with [Official SAT Practice on Khan Academy](#)[®]. Your answers will automatically be scored at the end of your test, and the timer will keep you on track with section time limits.

*The Central Bucks School District offers [E-Prep](#), a free standardized test prep and practice program for the PSAT, SAT and ACT to all its students. Students are automatically registered for this program; registration information was sent to your student via their cbsd district email account. If they cannot find the email or have problems logging in, please contact their school counselor or school librarian.
