Today in class you will spend time reading and responding to different resources on the Holocaust Memorial Museum's website. Please write down everything from today in a Word document or on Office 365.

- First click on the following link (https://www.ushmm.org/learn/students/the-holocaust-a-learning-site-for-students) and choose a new topic connected to the Holocaust to learn about. As I've asked before in class, please choose a topic that you are comfortable reading about. Once you have chosen a topic and read the page on it, please...
 - a. Write down <u>5 facts</u> you learned.
 - b. Explain in 2-3 sentences how this topic relates to Elie Wiesel's memoir, Night.

Next, please go to the following link (https://www.ushmm.org/remember/the-holocaust-survivors-and-victims-resource-center/benjamin-and-vladka-meed-registry-of-holocaust-survivors/behind-every-name-a-story). Here, you will have the opportunity to read an essay from a survivor of the Holocaust and learn their story. Please choose 1 essay and read it thoroughly. Once again, please choose an essay that you are comfortable reading. You might have to scan over the essay first to get an idea of what it is about. Then answer the following questions in complete sentences:
 - Briefly describe who this person is and where they were born (if stated).
 Then explain how the Holocaust first affected them (i.e. German troops invaded their town).
 - Write down <u>3 details</u> this survivor includes that stuck out to you. Explain for one detail WHY it stuck out to you.
 - 3. Copy down <u>1 sentence</u> from the essay and interpret it: what is the writer saying and what does it mean to you?
 - Lastly, make at least <u>2 connections</u> between this survivor's story and Elie Wiesel's story.
