Community

The Central Bucks School District is located 25 miles north of Philadelphia in the heart of Bucks County. CBSD is the third largest school district in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and is the largest suburban school district in the state. It encompasses nine municipalities, with the Borough of Doylestown being the largest population center and county seat. District enrollment is just under 20,000 students. CBSD is comprised of fifteen elementary schools (K-6), five middle schools (7-9) and three senior high schools (10-12). CB West's total student enrollment for the 2022-23 school year is approximately 1500.

Curriculum

CB West operates under a block scheduling model, with four instructional periods per day. Courses are classified into one of the following areas: Advanced Placement; Honors; Academic; or Special Education. The first level of study of a world language is offered to students beginning in Grade 8. Career and Technology Education courses are offered at Middle Bucks Institute of Technology (MBIT) starting in 10th grade, with programs including 10 career clusters and 22 career pathways and with options to participate in co-op programs with area employers.

Grades, Weight, and Ranking

CBSD does not report class rank. Grading is on a 4.0 scale. AP courses are weighted by 1.0 (ex: An A is 5.0), and Honors courses are weighted by .25 (ex: An A is 4.25). Ninth grade students, housed in our Middle Schools, may take weighted Honors courses, but do not have access to AP courses.

COVID-19 Impacts on Central Bucks School District Grading Procedures in the 19-20 School Year (Students in the Class of 2023 were in their 9th grade year)

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Pennsylvania's Governor closed all schools on March 13, 2020, and they remained closed for the remainder of the 2019-2020 school year. CBSD began Distance Learning after March 13. In CBSD, 9th grade students are housed in the middle schools, and therefore are in a different scheduling model than the high schools, with 7 periods per day. Students who were enrolled in half-year electives in 9th grade were unilaterally given a grade of "CR" for ALL elective courses that began in the second semester, regardless of their final grade.

For the Class of 2023, please note the following:

- 1. All students received *credit* for all courses completed in the spring semester.
 - a. Pass (P) = final grade above 60%
 - b. Credit Received (CR) = final grade below 60%
 - c. Grades of Pass or CR have no impact on cumulative GPA. Only letter grades impact the calculation of cumulative GPA.
- 2. Exceptions to the Pass/CR grading scale:
 - a. In consideration of access, equity, and student resources, the District gave students the *option* to receive a letter grade (A-D), or a Pass/CR in the following courses.
 - 3100: AP Biology
 - 3101/3101B/3101Y: AP Chemistry
 - 1300Y: AP Psychology
 - 1101Y: AP English Language and Composition
 - 1000: AP United States History
- 3. The District decided not to introduce any new courses during COVID. Some electives were originally scheduled to begin in Marking Period 4 (April 2020).
 - a. In-progress courses from Marking Period 3 (which started in January) were extended until the end of the year. Accordingly, the credit value of these courses was adjusted. For example, credit values of 0.25 became 0.5, and 0.5 became 1.0.

b. Students who lost essential credit due to the cancellation of MP4 courses were issued Credit Adjustments ("COVD, CRDT ADJUST") on their transcripts. Students received a grade of "EX," which had no impact on GPA calculation.
