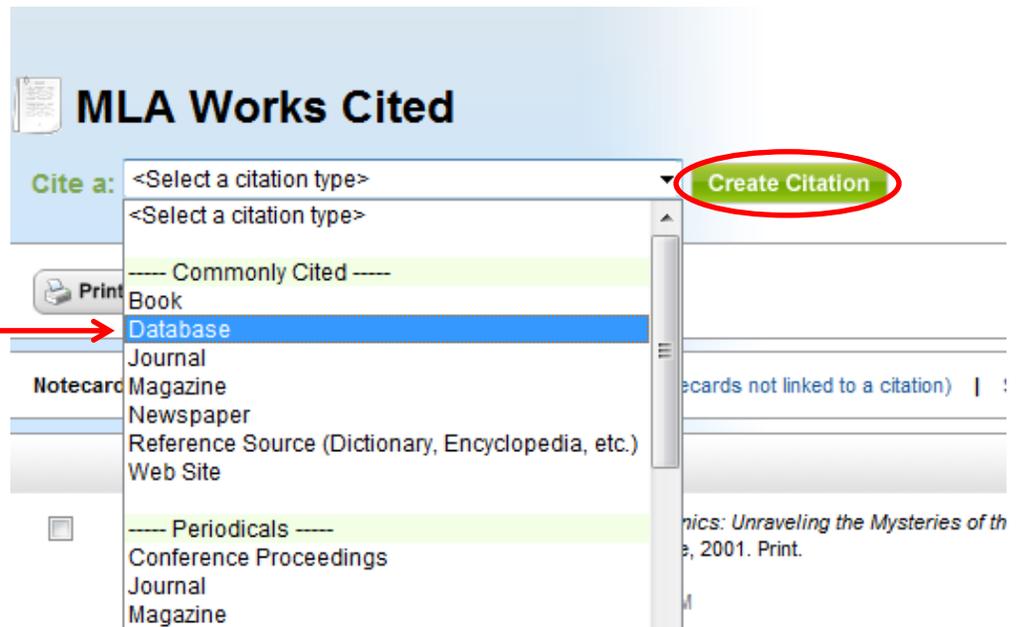


▶ CITING ABC-CLIO WITH NOODLETOOLS

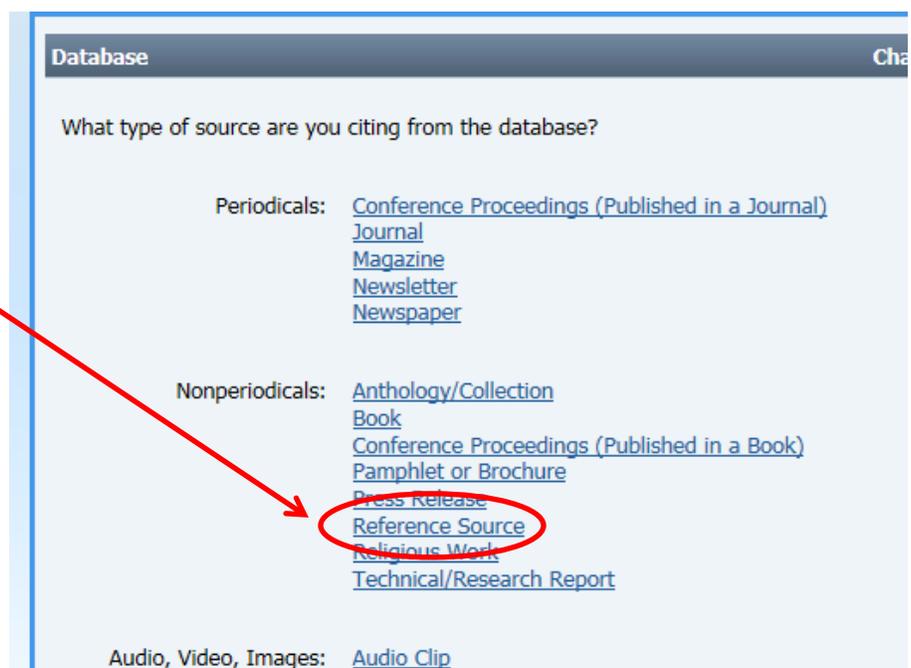
ABC CLIO Database

When citing from ABC CLIO, since all of the content is original (not taken from anywhere else, like a newspaper or magazine) you will always cite an entry like this:

- Using the dropdown menu select **Database** and then choose **Create Citation**.



- On the next screen, choose **Reference**



SECTION 1:

- Choose *E-publication (born digital)*
- Fill in the Database/publisher: ABC-CLIO
- Enter the year of e-publication (usually the current year)
- Copy & paste the URL*

- Explain why you categorized a source as primary or secondary.
- Sources of visual materials and oral interviews, if used, must also be included.
- List only those sources that you used to develop your entry.
- An annotation normally should be only 2-3 sentences long.
