When citing from ABC CLIO, since all of the content is original (not taken from anywhere else, like a newspaper or magazine) you will always cite an entry like this:





### **SECTION 1:**

- Choose E-publication (born digital)
- Fill in the Database/publisher: ABC-LIO
- Enter the year of e-publication (usually the current year)
- Copy & paste the URL\*



\*Use the URL (web page address) from the address bar at the top of the ABC-CLIO page you are citing. (You want the address that takes you back to this exact page. Click the link at some point to make sure it works.)
