

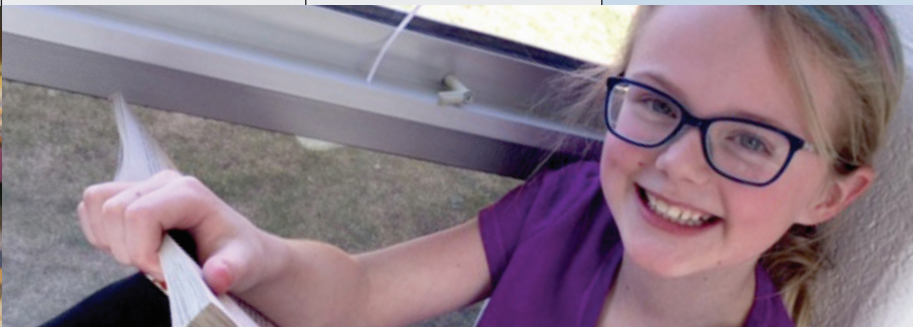
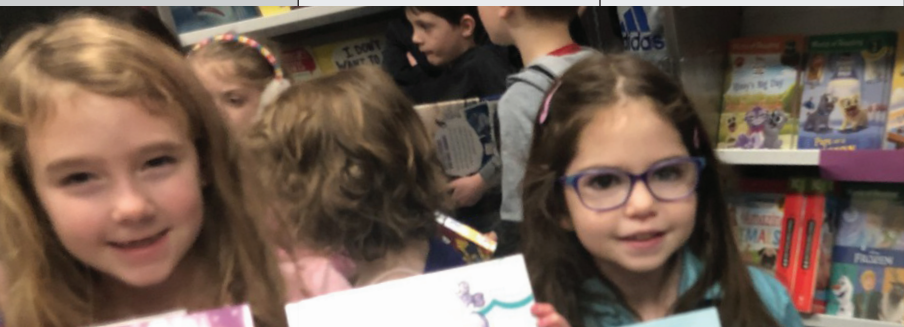


SCHOOL CLOSINGS – MODIFIED KINDERGARTEN SCHEDULE –

The Central Bucks Schools will provide all students with the academic and problem-solving skills essential for personal development, responsible citizenship, and life-long learning.

Central Bucks Board of School Directors

The board of school directors, known informally as the school board, is a legislative body of citizens who are elected locally and who serve as agents of the state legislature to provide a “thorough and efficient” system of education as mandated by the Pennsylvania Constitution. Each board consists of nine members who serve four-year terms without pay. The superintendent is also an official (though non-voting) member of the board. Board members can be elected at large or by region. Central Bucks has nine voting regions, which can each elect one director.

The school board meeting schedule can be found on the CBSD website. The board must adopt a meeting calendar each December, which is published in the local newspaper before the first meeting in January. The school board may also plan a special meeting for a designated topic, such as adoption of the budget or the holding of a hearing. All special meetings must be advertised. All business meetings are held at 7:30 p.m. in the Central Bucks Educational Services Center located at 16 Welden Drive, Doylestown, PA.

Members of the public are invited to attend school board meetings. A period for public comment is scheduled at every school board meeting. Citizens who wish to comment during that time can sign up at the lectern prior to the meeting. Each speaker is given three minutes to speak. The board will listen, take comments and questions under advisement, and not respond at this time. The presiding officer will refer questions to the superintendent for research and response.
