SCHOOL PROFILE 2025-2026

Community

The Central Bucks School District is located 25 miles north of Philadelphia in the heart of Bucks County. CBSD is the third largest school district in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and is the largest suburban school district in the state. It encompasses nine municipalities, with the Borough of Doylestown being the largest population center and county seat. District enrollment is just under 20,000 students. CBSD is comprised of fifteen elementary schools (K-6), five middle schools (7-9) and three senior high schools (10-12). CB West's total student enrollment for the 2025-26 school year is approximately 1400.

Curriculum

CB West operates on a block scheduling model, featuring four instructional periods per day. Courses are offered across several academic levels, including Advanced Placement (AP), Honors, Academic, and Special Education. Students may begin studying a world language as early as Grade 8, providing a strong foundation in global communication. In 10th grade, students have the opportunity to enroll in Career and Technology Education programs at the Middle Bucks Institute of Technology (MBIT). These programs span 10 career clusters and 22 career pathways, with options for cooperative education (co-op) experiences in partnership with local employers.

We are partnered with Delaware Valley University to offer a Dual Enrollment Program. Available courses include:
Calculus I – 4 college credits Statistics & Data Analysis – 3 college credits
Environmental Sustainability – 3 college credits Sociology – 3 college credits

Grades, Weight, and Ranking

Central Bucks does not report class rank. Grading is on a 4.0 scale. AP courses are weighted by 1.0 (ex: An A is 5.0), and Honors courses are weighted by .25 (ex: An A is 4.25). Ninth grade students are housed in our Middle Schools, they may take weighted Honors courses, but do not have access to AP courses.
