Community

The Central Bucks School District is located 25 miles north of Philadelphia in the heart of Bucks County. It encompasses nine municipalities, with the Borough of Doylestown being the largest population center and county seat. CBSD is the third largest school district in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and is the largest suburban school district in the state. District enrollment is just under 20,000 students. CBSD is comprised of fifteen elementary schools (K-6), five middle schools (7-9) and three senior high schools (10-12). CB West's total student enrollment for the 2018-19 school year is 1,486.

Curriculum

Central Bucks High School West operates under a block scheduling model, with four, 90-minute instructional periods per day. Courses are classified into one of the following areas: *Advanced Placement; Honors; Academic; or Special Education*. Career and Technology Education courses are offered at Middle Bucks Institute of Technology (MBIT), with programs including 10 career clusters and 22 career pathways.

Grades, Weight, and Ranking

CBSD does not report class rank. Grading is on a 4.0 scale. AP courses are weighted by 1.0 (ex: an A is 5.0), and Honors courses are weighted by .25 (ex: an A is 4.25). Ninth grade students may take weighted Honors courses (prior to 2017-18, students' 9th grade Advanced courses were not weighted).

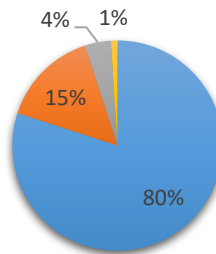

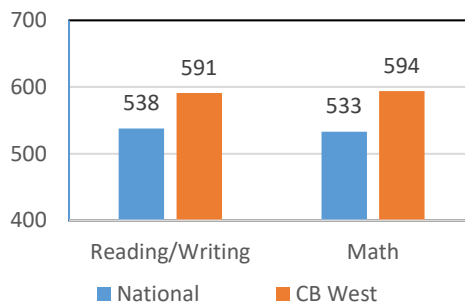
