2021-2022 SCHOOL YEAR



Students will attend school in person,
5-days per week.



The school day will return to regular arrival and dismissal times.



All teachers will be in-person, in classrooms.

The 2021-2022 school year will see a return of the co-curricular and extracurricular programs, activities, and school culture components that are essential to Central Bucks. Volunteers will return to classrooms, assemblies and field trips will be planned, and students will have a traditional schedule with a full lunch/recess period, etc.



WHAT FAMILIES SHOULD KNOW...

Central Bucks will not require proof of a COVID-19 vaccine of students or employees. The Pennsylvania Department of Education is the governing body that determines which vaccines are required for students' public school attendance.



WHAT FAMILIES SHOULD KNOW...

Per the board approved 2021-2022 health and safety plan, masking will be optional when students return to school on August 30. The plan is intended to be responsive – taking into consideration any change in the virus' trajectory at the local level, and/or recommendations from the Bucks County Health Department. The plan will be a standing item on monthly board meeting agendas.
