Dear Parent/Guardian,

This letter is to inform you that a student in your child's classroom has a severe peanut allergy. Strict avoidance of peanut products is the only way to prevent a life threatening allergic reaction. We are asking your assistance in providing the student with a safe learning environment.

If exposed to peanuts, the student may develop a life threatening allergic reaction that would require emergency medical treatment. To reduce the risk of exposure the classroom will be designated peanut safe. We are asking that you do not send in any foods which contain peanuts for individual daily class snacks or party/shared treats. It is also important to reinforce with your child that food should not be shared.

Since lunch is eaten in the cafeteria, your child may bring peanuts products for lunch but please pack this separately from the snack. We appreciate your support of these procedures and if you have questions, please contact me.
