Students will identify substances that are good for their bodies. Students will identify things to do to stay healthy. Students will set a goal for keeping their incredible machines healthy. Students will explain why you cannot tell what a drug is by looking at it. Students will explain why medicines have safety caps. Students will identify rules for safe use of medicines.
