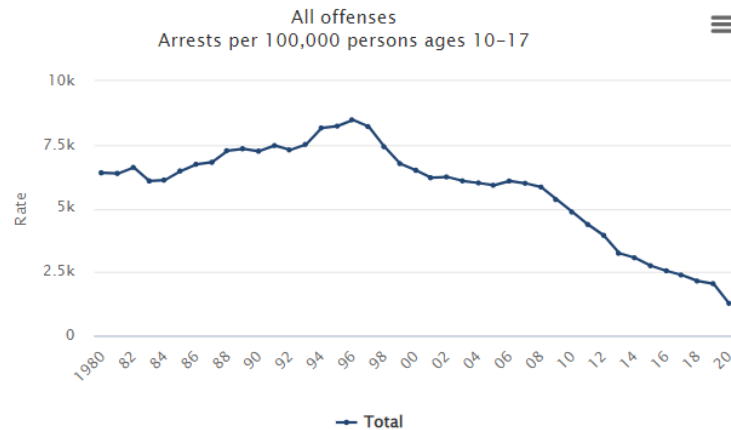

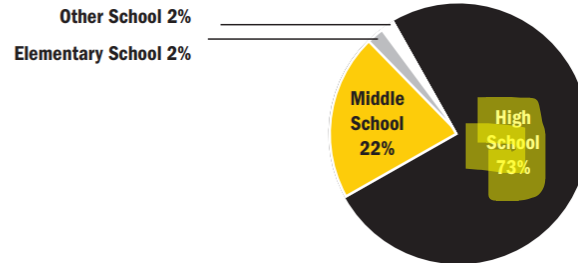
Juvenile Arrest Rate Trends

The juvenile arrest rate for murder reached its lowest level in 2012, 83% below the 1993 peak; since 2012, the rate increased 30% through 2018 (from 2.2 to 2.8 per 100,000 youth) where it remained through 2020.



Office of Juvenile Justice & Delinquency Prevention (USDJ)

COMMUNITIES: Approximately one-third ($n = 14$, 34%) of the attacks occurred in schools located in suburban communities, while 11 attacks occurred in cities (27%). Ten incidents were carried out in rural schools (24%), and the fewest attacks took place in small towns ($n = 6$, 15%).⁵
