2: Expanding Vocabulary

- 2. Be on the look out for words that are **new to you!** How will you discover their meaning?
 - a. inferring = background knowledge + text clues
 - b. online dictionary
 - c. talk about the word with a family member or friend
- 3. Choose HOW you will use the words that are new to you?
 - a. Keep a notebook like Max in Max's Words
 - b. Use the "new to you" words in **your conversations**. Tell people about the meaning behind the words. It's so important to say the words out loud and hear how they sound and work!
 - c. Challenge yourself to use the "new to you" words in **your** writing: poetry, narratives, nonfiction, opinion pieces.
