
## **Definitions and Terms:**

- 1. The <u>equator</u> is an imaginary line that divides the Earth into the northern and southern <u>hemispheres</u>.
- 2. The <u>prime meridian</u> is and imaginary line that divides the Earth into the eastern and western **hemispheres**.
- 3. A <u>compass rose</u> is displayed on a map to note the cardinal and intermediate directions.
- 4. North, South, East and West are **cardinal directions**.
- 5. Northeast, Southeast, Northwest, and Southwest are <u>intermediate directions</u>.
- 6. A **map key** explains the symbols used on a map.
- 7. A **map scale** is a measured line on a map that helps us measure the actual distances from one place to another.

## Some interesting facts:

- 1. The **Pacific Ocean** is the largest of our five oceans.
- 2. Washington, D.C. is our nation's capital.
- 3. Harrisburg is the capitol of Pennsylvania.
- 4. **Antarctica** is the coldest continent. It is surrounded by the **Southern Ocean.**
- 5. The United States, Canada and Mexico make up the continent of North American. Canada is to the **north** of the United States.
