Poster: Your poster should include:

- ☒ 1 sheet of poster board(no Tri-Folds)
- ☒ Your name
- ☒ Title (e.g. "Stanley's Visit to ____")
- ☒ Names of places Stanley visited
- ☒ Pictures (postcards, photos, maps, etc.) of places Stanley visited
- ☒ Captions for each picture **neatly printed** and written in **complete sentences**
- ☒ LOTS of COLOR
- ☒ Your NEATEST second grade work!

Presentation: You should be able to do the following:

- ☒ Locate where Stanley has been on a map
- ☒ Tell who Stanley visited
- ☒ Tell where Stanley went
- ☒ Tell main details/ highlights of his trip
- ☒ Your presentation should last about 5 minutes

** You will be able to look at your poster and talk about it during your presentation. You may also read an entry from the journal and show any other souvenirs Stanley brought back.

***Please practice your presentation at home before coming to share in school!**
