SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

EDUCATIONAL TECHNOLOGY UPDATE – PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT AND ISTE REVIEW

Mr. Jason Jaffe, Supervisor of Educational Technology, and Ms. Suzanne Dailey, Staff Development Facilitator, provided an update on technology within the district, an overview of professional development, and the International Society for Technology in Education (ISTE) conference. Mr. Jaffe reported that during the 2015-2016 school year over 1,082 student iPads, 2,929 student laptops, 907 teacher laptops, and 143 document cameras will have been distributed; and over 417 Wi-Fi access points will be across the district. Currently, 100% of all K-6 classrooms and all 7-12 core content areas have an interactive whiteboard, and 100% projectors will be mounted in the district. Ms. Dailey stated that 90 CB staff members (administrators and professionals) from 23 CB schools attended the ISTE conference held in Philadelphia from June 28 – July 1, 2015 along with over 20,000 attendees. Board members viewed a short clip of what the ISTE conference looked like. On August 5 and August 17 CB attendees met to reflect on the conference and participated in panel discussions and listened to teacher led sessions. Mr. Jaffe and Ms. Dailey stated that during the summer of 2015, 213 sessions were offered to approximately 1,238 participants in a variety of workshop (traditional, hybrid, and online) formats. Staff Development will always be available to further enhance instruction across the district. The presentation ended with Board members viewing written comments from administrators and professional staff on how technology has impacted student learning and their classrooms.

A RESOLUTION

OF THE CENTRAL BUCKS SCHOOL DISTRICT CONSENTING TO THE ISSUANCE OF MIDDLE BUCKS AREA VOCATIONAL TECHNICAL SCHOOL AUTHORITY REVENUE BONDS SERIES OF 2015

WHEREAS, on the 8th day of June, 2015, at a public meeting, the executive council ("Executive Council") of Middle Bucks Institute of Technology ("MBIT"), consisting of representatives from Centennial School District, Central Bucks School District, Council Rock School District and New Hope-Solebury School District adopted a resolution, consenting to the issuance of a new series of bonds by the Middle Bucks Area Vocational Technical School Authority ("Authority"); and

WHEREAS, the new series of bonds shall be designated as the Authority's Revenue Bonds, Series of 2015 ("Bonds"), or some other appropriate designation, and be issued to provide funds to refund the remaining portion of the Authority's Revenue Bonds, Series of 2006 ("2006 Bonds") provided that the savings level of at least 3% of the refunded principal net of all costs is achieved ("2006 Refunding Program") and to refund the Authority's Revenue Bonds, Series of 2003 ("2003 Bonds"); provided that the savings level of at least 3% of the refunded principal net of all costs is achieved ("2003 Refunding Program"); and

WHEREAS, either the 2006 Refunding Program or the 2003 Refunding Program or both, (referred to as the "Refunding Program") can proceed provided that the savings level target is achieved resulting in a debt service savings thereby; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Council of MBIT is desirous to secure such a savings; and

WHEREAS, as a participating district of MBIT, it is Central Bucks School District's obligation along with the other participating school districts' obligation to pay its proportionate share of costs related to the Refunding Program in the manner set forth in the articles of agreement of MBIT.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. That the Central Bucks School District hereby consents to the issuance of Middle Bucks Area Vocational Technical Authority Revenue Bonds, Series of 2015.
- 2. That the Central Bucks School District authorizes the President of this School District or such other officer to execute any ancillary documents from any and all parties including but not limited to any insurer to the extent necessary and take all other actions necessary to carry out the Refunding Program.
