Heard Superintendent's Report: Achievement and Data Report

Richard Kratz, Director of Teaching and Learning, reviewed achievement data with the Board. Data presented included results from PSSA, Keystone Exams, ACT, SAT, and AP Exams. Heard Public Comment:

Bob Burchell of Warwick yielded his speaking time to Rebecca Cartee-Haring.

Rebecca Cartee-Haring of Doylestown spoke about protecting female athletes, students, and staff, gender inequality, the 2021 Trans-Inclusion Playbook by We Coach, and trans-inclusive policies. Ms. Cartee-Haring spoke about supporting CB trans-students, CBSD Athletic Directors and head coaches, PIAA, sex education classes, a Federal equal pay lawsuit, and the hiring and pay practices at CBSD.

Leo Burchell, CBSD student, spoke of support for trans and queer students, writing his own school board meeting public comment speeches, the PAYS survey, trans athletes, Policy 321, Pride flags, names, pronouns, bullying, and listening to students.

Anne Ferguson of Doylestown Township spoke about voting in school board elections, board member behavior and statements at previous meetings, and paying a PR firm to improve image.

Kate Nazemi of Doylestown Township spoke about recent district-wide board communication, discrimination and bullying, policies that restrict learning, allowing symbols of inclusion back into classrooms, DEI training, and focusing on kids.

Amy McGahran of Doylestown Township yielded her speaking time to Kathy Cranmer.

Kathy Cranmer of Doylestown Township spoke about the Founding Fathers, religion, faith, read aloud some passages from James and Luke, Moms for Liberty, bullying, book banning, the pandemic, hiring a PR firm and attorneys, and tax dollars.

Tricia Doebler of Chalfont spoke about getting back to academic leadership, employee terminations listed on the agenda, and the amazing teachers at CBSD.

Sharon Walbridge of Warrington commended President Hunter for fostering a positive learning environment, sociopolitical agendas, respect for all religions, NEA union dues, school board candidates receiving election money from teachers' unions, the Keystone Teachers Association (KEYTA), and shared website addresses <u>www.unionchoiceforschoolworkers.com</u> and <u>www.optouttoday.com</u>

Leslie Watson of Buckingham thanked President Hunter, the Board, and Dr. Lucabaugh. Ms. Watson spoke about the CBSD Mission Statement, parental rights, banning sexualized content from children, the PAYS report showing a decline in bullying, local news reporting, transparency, and the ACLU complaint.

Daniel Grabianowski of Plumstead spoke about school board elections and candidates, sexually explicit books in CB schools, upholding parental rights, the ACLU complaint, flags that were flown over Boston City Hall, book banning, Policy 321, and focusing on education.

Mara Witsen of Chalfont congratulated President Hunter on being re-elected Board President for 2023 and spoke about local media, a return to basics, learning loss cause by school closures, local journalists, and putting trust in the board majority to gain back some of the ground that was lost over the last two years.

Ed Mackouse of Buckingham commended President Hunter and the board. Mr. Mackouse spoke about policies, attorneys, Black Lives Matter riots in Philadelphia, safety and security, Philadelphia and Montgomery Counties adopting Woke policies, and male teachers being hired to protect female teachers.

Francisco Castillo of Buckingham thanked the Board for looking out for kids and yielded the remainder of his speaking time to Shannon Harris.

Shannon Harris of Buckingham spoke about the Woke political agenda, recession, inflation, owning her own business, allowing students to pretend that they are cats in school, the need for Policy 321, sports, Title IX, hormone blockers, transgender policies, student athletes, the CB East football team banquet, learning loss, and focusing on teaching and subject matter.

Christina Bucci of Chalfont spoke about the Achievement and Data Report, early Kindergarten admission, and read aloud from a 2015 report published by the University of Iowa's Belin-Blank Center for Gifted Education and Talent Development.

Pam Masciotro of Warrington spoke about the Achievement and Data Report, her daughter's CBSD education, and yielded the remainder of her speaking time to Vonna DeArmond.

Vonna DeArmond of Plumstead Township thanked CB students that attended last month's meeting and thanked Dr. Lucabaugh, Administration, and Mr. Kratz for the data presented and for addressing the consequences of lockdowns. Ms. DeArmond spoke about religious bigotry, online posts by others that misrepresented comments she made at a previous meeting by splicing portions together, the upcoming election, First Amendment rights, and all religious beliefs being allowed to be expressed in schools.

Donna Shannon of Doylestown yielded her speaking time to Candace Biofore.

Candace Biofore (not listed on sign-up sheet) spoke about Policies 109.2 and 321, books with sexually explicit material, acting upon the data on learning loss, removing tricky people from the school district, and Dr. Ohrt.

Karin Majewski, CBSD employee, invited board members to visit her classroom. Ms. Majewski spoke about just wanting to teach, putting students first, fear and hesitation about speaking out, unions, and opting out of unions.
