LESSON PLANS</p> <p>To ensure continuity of instruction, the Board requires professional staff members to develop and maintain daily lesson plans.</p> <p>The administration views use of lesson plans as a means to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Assure the proficiency of each individual student relative to Pennsylvania and Central Bucks standards by improving instruction and increasing learning. 2. Assist a substitute so meaningful educational instruction is maintained during a teacher's absence. 3. Provide a basis on which a supervisor can evaluate a lesson including: classroom routine; organization; instructional skills; quality of lesson development; alignment of objectives to state and district standards; procedures that are differentiated and appropriate for delivering instructional objectives to a range of diverse learners; clarity regarding what students will know and be able to do at the end of the lesson; appropriate assessment(s) that are aligned to objectives; and other components that may apply within varied instructional contexts. <p>To facilitate more effective instruction, lesson plans must be prepared in advance. Lesson and unit plans must be maintained and may be inspected. Lesson plans must conform to the guidelines established by the Central Bucks School District and building principal.</p> <p>Teachers shall thoroughly prepare for all daily lessons and create written plans reflecting such preparation.</p> <p>Teachers are to provide adequate directions and plans for substitutes; the purpose of which shall be to continue the ongoing program and/or provide a meaningful educational alternative that relates to specific objectives and standards normally addressed in the course at the time of the teacher's absence.</p>
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<p>3. Guidelines</p>	<p>While consistency in lesson planning is desirable, no one lesson-planning template is appropriate for all types of instruction. All daily and unit lesson plans shall be comprehensive, reflecting current research and representing effective learning experiences for all students.</p> <p>Guidelines for implementation of this policy shall include:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Format(s) for lesson plans shall be decided at the building level, i.e. school-wide formats, departmental formats, individual formats, or any combination.2. While teachers are required to be thoroughly prepared for each daily lesson, plans may be prepared for each lesson or on a long-term basis, i.e. unit of work, whichever is most appropriate.3. Material to be used in a lesson, such as technology, texts, manipulatives, etc., should be included in the plan.4. Lesson plans for individualized programs should reflect a general overview and purpose of the instructional program; individual student records may serve as an integral part of the lesson plan.5. Effective lesson plans include appropriate instructional approaches for a range of diverse learners.6.
