Dear Fifth Grader,

Hello! My name is Mrs. Howley and I will be your teacher this upcoming school year. I hope that you had a nice and relaxing summer break and that you are ready for all of the challenges and responsibilities of being a fifth grader.

Let me tell you a little bit about myself. I grew up in this area and went to Barclay Elementary, Warwick Elementary, Tamanend Middle School, and Central Bucks East. When I finished high school I knew I wanted to be a teacher. I studied for my degree in Early Childhood and Elementary Education degree from Bloomsburg University. I have always loved school and learning, so I went on to get my Masters in Education from Gratz College and I completed more graduate class courses from Colorado State. This year will be my 16th year teaching in Central Bucks and my 10th year teaching fifth grade.

When I am not in school, I love to spend time with, Mr. Howley, my son Collin, and my daughter Claire, who attend Jamison Elementary. My family has a shore house in Sea Isle City, NJ, so you can see me down there most of the summer, enjoying the beach and the water. The first few weeks of school will be spent building our classroom community and establishing a culture of respect, responsibility, collaboration and citizenship. As a fifth grader, you will learn a lot of important reading strategies, and you will also have opportunities to participate in various reading activities, such as book clubs, to help you comprehend the texts you read. We will use the Lead 21 and the Comprehension Toolkit programs, throughout the school year! In Everyday Math, you will explore fractions, decimals, probability, geometry, operations, and problem solving. You will spend a lot of time this year learning about writing and researching. You will create 5- paragraph writing pieces and learn how to take notes and write about your research. Prepare yourself for some creative social studies activities and some exciting science experiments throughout the year. You will also learn vital organizational, test preparation, and technology skills, this school year.

In fifth grade, you will work hard to find a system of organization that works for you. A great deal of time is spent learning important study and time management skills. Central Bucks provides the supplies essential for learning; however, some students like to bring their own supplies to school. Suggested grade level supply lists are on the Bridge Valley Website. In addition, the following items may be more helpful to you in our classroom; these are, however, not required:

- ❑ Hard plastic, expandable accordion file folder
- ❑ 6 plastic folders with prongs (blue, green, red, yellow, and color of your choice)
- ❑ 4-one subject spiral notebooks (if possible, get the **Five Star** brand in blue, red, green, and yellow)

- ❑ 1-12 pack of colored pencils
- ❑ 1-12 pack of crayons
- ❑ 1 pack of sharpened #2 pencils
- ❑ 1-8 pack of Crayola fine tip colored markers (optional)
- ❑ 1 pack of assorted highlighters
- ❑ 1 pack of 4 X 6 index cards
- ❑ A sketchbook for art
- ❑ 6 glue sticks for the year
- ❑ Scissors (optional)

Our classroom could also use a few items to keep us tidy and healthy each day. If you are willing to donate any of the following, it would be greatly appreciated:

- ❑ Containers of sanitizing wipes
- ❑ Boxes of tissues

Thank you in advance for taking the time to accumulate these supplies. Your support with organization will help the school year run smoothly.
